The twelve labors of Hercules

Perseus and Medusa the Gorgon

Another of Zeus's children was Perseus. He was asked by Polydectes, the king of Seriphos, to bring him the head of Medusa. Medusa was a gorgon whose gaze turned people to stone. Perseus was helped by Athena, who gave him a highly polished shield, and Hermes, who gave him a curved sword. When he reached Medusa's cave, he approached the gorgon by looking at her reflection in the shield. Using the sword he cut off her head and wrapped it in a bag.
